
Dear Secretary Vilsack:

Dear Senator Coburn:

Thank you for your letter of February 3, 2011, requesting information on individuals and farming entities with Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) exceeding \$1 million that received program payments during fiscal years 2007, 2008, 2009, and 2010. The Department of Agriculture (USDA) does not capture the recipient's AGI for any of the programs listed on the Schedule A provided with your letter.

The enclosed information indicates whether the authorizing statutes established an AGI eligibility threshold for each of the programs. For programs with an AGI eligibility threshold, the program application requests the applicant to self certify his or her income eligibility. During the application review process USDA validates the self certification against the Internal Revenue Service's (IRS) database of AGI. However, the IRS only indicates whether their records indicate a program participant exceeds any AGI limits established in the authorizing statute, and does not provide actual tax information or dollar amounts. Additionally, as noted in the enclosure, several of these programs do provide USDA with a waiver authority for individuals or entities that exceed the program's AGI threshold. But, USDA does not record or store any data on the applicants' and recipients' AGI.

Redactions of AGI Waiver Forms

This memorandum responds to a request from Senator Coburn's office for a rationale explaining redactions of portions of Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) Waiver Request Worksheets for Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS or the agency) Programs. These redactions were made by the agency in order to comply with section 1619 of the 2008 farm bill, Pub. L. No. 110-246.

Section 1619 is a provision broadly protecting producer information. Section 1619 provides, in pertinent part, that

the Secretary of Agriculture shall not disclose information provided by an agricultural producer or owner of agricultural land concerning the agricultural operation, farming or conservation practices *or the land itself*, in order to participate in programs of the Department;...
(emphasis added)

We understand that the portions of the forms that were redacted by NRCS were specific attributes of the applicants' land that NRCS would not have had such information but for the applicants' application to participate in NRCS programs. Consequently, the requirements of section 1619 apply and require withholding of such information.

Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) Limitation Waiver Request Worksheet NRCS Conservation Programs (FY 2010)

A person or legal entity that exceeds the Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) requirements of the 2008 Farm Bill will not be eligible to receive payments in Farm Bill programs (AMA, AWEP, CBWI, CCPI, CIG, CSP, EQIP, GRP, FRPP, WHIP, and WRP) unless waived by the Chief of the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) on a case-by-case basis. The determination for approval will be based upon whether the proposed application will protect environmentally sensitive land of special significance.

When an applicant requests an AGI waiver, the Designated Conservationist (DC) should have the applicant prepare a written request for an AGI waiver addressed to the Chief. The DC will submit the applicant's written request, along with this completed waiver request worksheet package, through appropriate channels to the State Conservationist (STC) for initial review (Note: Federally recognized Tribes are not subject to AGI limitations).

For those requests that meet all the requirements listed in Section 5, the STC will forward this complete waiver package through the Regional Conservationist to the Chief for consideration or decision. State Conservationists shall provide written notification to all applicants of the Chief's decision with appropriate appeal rights or acknowledgement of waiver.

Section 1: Application Program Information and Eligible Categories

Identify the program and length of applicant's proposed contract or easement (List only one program per waiver request):

The rapid destruction of bottomland hardwood forests in this area, and the concerns of conservationists about preserving a sustainable area of this habitat, gave rise to the Columbia Bottomlands Conservation Plan (U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service 1997). The Plan proposes a goal of 28,328 acres of habitat conserved under the combined efforts of private, state, and federal entities, thus ensuring protection of at least 10% of the original ecosystem area.

- The protection of this property is a priority in multiple conservation plans. 148 acres of the property make up 20% of the Core Area of the Pawtuckaway Conservation Focus Area in the Land Conservation Plan for New Hampshire's Coastal Watershed. Other pending and completed conservation projects along with this one would protect 75% of the Core Area. It could also support this report's larger goals by creating a 515 acre block of protected land by adding 154 acres to the land already being conserved by private owners and the Southeast Land Trust. Protecting this parcel through a WRP easement will protect about 3,000 feet of the Pawtuckaway River, 35 acres of wetland, and valuable wildlife habitat from development.
- 34 acres of the property are Highest Ranked Wildlife Habitat according to the NH Fish and Game's Wildlife Action Plan. The property contains identified habitat for four state endangered species, three species of special concern, and three species of interest to NH Fish and Game.

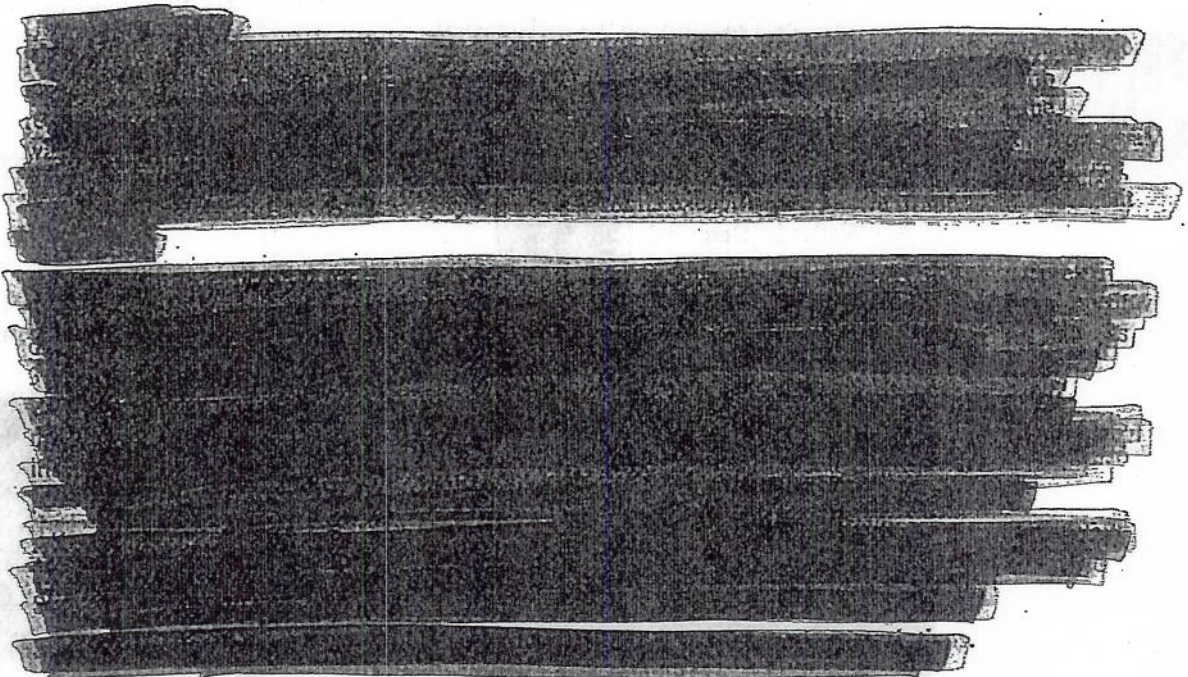

Allowing this Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program (WHIP) contract would benefit several of New Jersey's Resource Management plans.

The New Jersey Wildlife Action Plan for the Skylands region notes that the contamination and alteration of waterways and wetlands in the region negatively effect all wetland dependent species and species groups. Also reduction in stream flows and the persistence of dams have negative impacts on riparian and riverine species. Human encroachment into these areas also causes invasive non native plant species to flourish. These invasive species out compete the native plant communities and can effect wetland hydrology. The Wildlife Action plan also notes that a large portion of critical wildlife habitat in the region is on private land.

The US Fish and Wildlife Service Bog Turtle Recovery plan will have components met with this project. Bog turtles are found within a mile of this site and suitable foraging and hibernation/overwintering habitat will be created.

This project will also benefit the Eastern Brook Trout Joint Venture under the National Fish Habitat Action Plan. This group's aim is to enhance and restore brook trout habitat. By breaching the dam and restoring the natural flow of the Pohatcong Creek we will enhance the habitat for the brook trout that reside in the stream.

We will also be supporting the Atlantic Coast Joint Venture of the North American Waterfowl Management Plan by creating waterfowl habitat in critical areas within the Atlantic flyway.

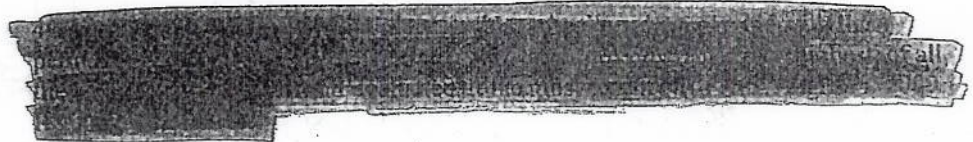

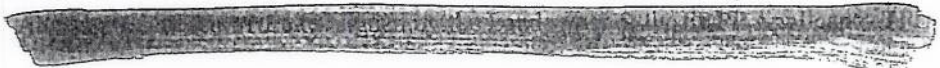

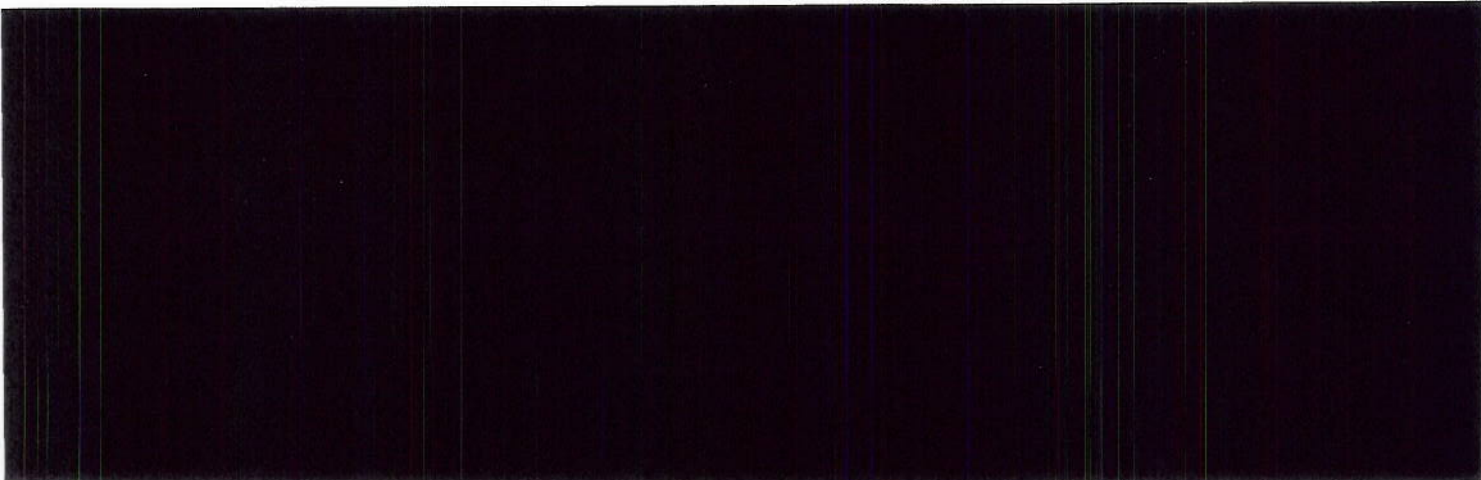

The following is GAO's response to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's letter dated October 9, 2008.

GAO's Comments

1. The report number has changed to GAO-09-67.
2. We recognized in the report that resource constraints limit USDA's ability to effectively enforce the adjusted gross income (AGI) requirements. As we stated, according to USDA officials, these resource constraints hamper the department's ability to examine complex tax and financial information, and field staff have other competing responsibilities that limit the time available for enforcing the AGI requirements.
3. We acknowledge that a small percentage of USDA's total farm program payments were made to individuals who exceeded the 2002 Farm Bill's income eligibility caps. The small percentage is to be expected: only a very small percentage of all individuals who file a tax return report an AGI exceeding \$2.5 million to the IRS. Furthermore, the fact that only a small percentage of recipients are potentially ineligible does not relieve USDA of its responsibility to enforce the AGI requirements. This percentage is also likely to increase because the 2008 Farm Bill lowers the income eligibility caps. Therefore, USDA will be at greater risk of making improper payments to more than the 2,702 individuals we found unless it has better management controls in place.

USDA is correct in stating that not all of the farm programs and payments listed in appendix III of this report were subject to the AGI limitation under the 2002 Farm Bill. That table was not intended to list only programs subject to the AGI limitation. To provide clarity, we have included a note below the table in appendix III explaining this fact.

4. We believe that it is important to place our discussion of income eligibility requirements in the context of other key eligibility requirements to provide a more comprehensive understanding of the conditions under which individuals may receive farm program payments. Although USDA is correct that the requirements for actively engaged in farming are not part of the AGI provision, we mention the issue of actively engaged in farming in this report to provide more

information regarding concerns we have previously raised about USDA's oversight of farm program payments.¹

5. As noted in the report, the 2008 Farm Bill directed the Secretary of Agriculture to establish statistically valid procedures to conduct targeted audits of persons or entities most likely to exceed the legislation's income eligibility caps. Therefore, to provide context for our discussion on how USDA ensured recipients met eligibility requirements, we provided information regarding concerns we had previously raised in our 2004 report about how USDA selected farm operations for compliance review.²
6. USDA is correct in stating that when the entity is AGI compliant and an interest holder is not AGI compliant, the entity is still eligible to receive a payment. However, the payment to the entity must be reduced by the share held by that interest holder. In our analysis of entities, we attributed payments to each interest holder based on the payment share of the interest holder as recorded in the Farm Service Agency's Permitted Entity database. For the 1,346 potentially ineligible individuals who we identify as receiving a payment through an entity, USDA did not reduce the payment to the entity based on the share held by the individual. (For further discussion of the methodology we used, see app. I.)
7. We have identified potentially ineligible recipients on the basis of their reported AGI. While we cannot name these recipients, we believe that providing as much demographic information as we can about these recipients, such as whether they reside near the farming operation, is helpful to users of this report.
8. USDA believes we should provide more information about the examples we cite in this report. Providing this information would allow USDA, which does not have authority to access tax information, to identify individual filers. Internal Revenue Code Section 6103 prohibits us from disclosing any additional information. We note here that some of the payments were issued directly to individuals while others were issued indirectly through entities. Regarding USDA's comment on

whether we made a commensurate reduction in the payment when the payment was made to an entity, we attributed payments to each interest holder based on the payment share of the interest holder as recorded in the Farm Service Agency's Permitted Entity database. With respect to USDA's comment on requesting authority to gain access to information on potentially improper payments, we recommended that the Secretary of Agriculture direct the Administrator of the Farm Service Agency to work with the Internal Revenue Service to develop a system for verifying the income eligibility for all recipients of farm program payments. We further stated that if the Secretary determines that it does not have the authority to develop such a system with the Commissioner of the Internal Revenue Service, we recommended that the Secretary request this authority from Congress, as appropriate.

9. We believe that explaining our use of the term "potentially improper payments" in the footnotes on pages 4 and 25 is sufficient.
10. Appendix I of this report specifies the documents we reviewed. As we noted, we reviewed guidance that USDA field offices use to determine compliance with the AGI requirements, including relevant statutes and regulations and agency policy and guidance. We believe that the intent of the AGI eligibility requirement is clear in the 2002 Farm Bill.

On February 22, 2011, you requested that the Office of Inspector General (OIG) review the assertions made by the Farm Service Agency (FSA) regarding its data-matching with the Social Security Administration's Death Master File. Specifically, you requested that we verify FSA's finding that less than 2 percent of the fiscal year (FY) 2007 payments made to deceased individuals were improper and warranted further review.

This letter is to apprise you that we have completed our preliminary review to track and reconcile the data FSA used to determine that less than 2 percent of the FY 2007 payments made to deceased individuals were improper. When attempting to reconcile the data in FSA's summary and detailed listings,¹ our review found a number of data inconsistencies and inaccuracies that affected FSA's reported improper payment error rate. Some payments identified as improper by the FSA field offices were omitted from the overpayment totals (for instance, those cases where equitable relief² or waivers were approved for the payment errors) or the field offices incorrectly entered data on the detailed listing. For example, some FSA field offices entered non-numeric characters in data fields reserved for numeric information, which resulted in those entries being erroneously counted as zero (or deleted) in the total figure for that State. If we include the omitted payments as overpayments (e.g., including the cases where equitable relief or waivers were approved) and make the formatting corrections to the data (without making any other adjustments due to other inconsistencies and inaccuracies), the improper payment error rate would exceed the amount reported by FSA.

However, given the data inconsistencies and inaccuracies that we found, this reconstructed improper payment error rate may be unreliable. In order to reconstruct a more reliable improper

payment error rate from FSA's data, we would need to perform a number of time-intensive procedures. We would need to reconcile each line of data with other data fields and make adjustments to correct for the various inconsistencies and inaccuracies that we found. These inconsistencies and inaccuracies affected at least four different fields on the detailed listings: Payment Amount; Explanation and Actions Completed; Overpayment Amount; and Total. The detailed listings have more than 120,000 lines of data. We would need to contact the FSA field offices to resolve questionable items, and FSA would need to provide OIG with updated information. We believe we would have to spend between \$150,000 to \$200,000 to complete this task. However, since we would be simply using FSA data and not verifying the data, we would not be able to opine as to the reliability of the reconstructed rate at the conclusion of this task. To test the reliability of the data and to come up with an independently verified improper payment error rate, we would have to expend considerably more than our initial cost estimate. This would likely involve considerable time and travel to the field to perform a detailed examination of a representative number of case files.

When we discussed these inconsistencies and inaccuracies in the FY 2007 data, FSA national officials acknowledged that there were problems with the FY 2007 data. They stated that they have improved this reporting process since FY 2007, which was the first year that FSA performed the data match and reconciliation with the Social Security Administration's Death Master File. For FY 2008 and subsequent years, FSA has circulated quarterly reports of identified deceased persons, based on the data reconciliation process, to State and county offices. FSA field offices are required to conduct additional data review and verification for such persons before issuing any payment, and must document in writing why the person, his/her estate, or his/her authorized representative is eligible for payment.

In addition to the above-cited modifications in its policies and procedures, FSA issued a final rule on December 29, 2010, to strengthen its controls. The above-described procedural changes were specified in the final rule. The final rule also added clarifying language that a payment will not be made on behalf of a deceased person except in specific factual circumstances.³ If effectively implemented, we believe that the full range of FSA policies and procedures should address the goal of further minimizing any improper payments to deceased persons. As the agency responsible for administering this program, FSA needs to monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of these newly implemented policies and procedures.

As described above, in order to validate or verify the improper payment error rate in FY 2007 or any subsequent fiscal year to deceased producers, we would need to allocate significant audit resources. We believe that reviewing and verifying data from several years back, from a system which no longer functions as it did in prior years, would not provide beneficial results as FSA has stated that it has since improved its reconciliation and verification process. We believe our limited resources could be more valuably spent at this time conducting other high priority work,



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such as that related to the implementation of the *Improper Payments Elimination and Recovery Act*, which was signed into law on July 22, 2010. We will, however, assess the need for a followup review of FSA's enhanced controls in our future audit plans.
