2 **SEC. 7. ENDING UNEMPLOYMENT PAYMENTS TO JOBLESS**

3 **MILLIONAIRES AND BILLIONAIRES.**

4 (a) PROHIBITION.—Notwithstanding any other provi-

5 sion of law, no Federal funds may be used to make pay-

6 ments of unemployment compensation (including such

7 compensation under the Federal-State Extended Com-

8 pensation Act of 1970 and the emergency unemployment

9 compensation program under title IV of the Supplemental

10 Appropriations Act, 2008) to an individual whose adjusted

1 gross income in the preceding year was equal to or greater
2 than \$1,000,000.

3 (b) COMPLIANCE.—Unemployment Insurance appli-
4 cations shall include a form or procedure for an individual
5 applicant to certify the individual's adjusted gross income
6 was not equal to or greater than \$1,000,000 in the pre-
7 ceding year.

8 (c) AUDITS.—The certifications required by sub-
9 section (b) shall be auditable by the U.S. Department of
10 Labor or the U.S. Government Accountability Office.

11 (d) STATUS OF APPLICANTS.—It is the duty of the
12 states to verify the residency, employment, legal, and in-
13 come status of applicants for Unemployment Insurance
14 and no Federal funds may be expended for purposes of
15 determining an individual's eligibility under this Act.

16 (e) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The prohibition under sub-
17 section (a) shall apply to weeks of unemployment begin-
18 ning on or after the date of the enactment of this Act.
